## **CIRCUMSTANCES:**

On Tuesday, August 4<sup>th</sup>, neighborhoods throughout Fort Bragg are being invited to join forces with thousands of communities nationwide for the "32nd Annual National Night Out" (NNO) crime and drug prevention event.
