### **CIRCUMSTANCES:**

On December 29, 2016 at approximately 9:53 p.m., Officers were dispatched to a report of a hit and run traffic collision, vehicle versus pedestrian, in the 300 block of North Main Street. Officers responded and located the victim laying in the north bound number 1 lane of North Main Street.

At the time the victim was being treated by Mendocino Coast District Hospital Ambulance staff and members of Fort Bragg Fire Department. Officers were made aware of an additional traffic collision north of Fort Bragg City Limits. The description of the vehicle matched that of the suspect vehicle that struck the pedestrian provided by witnesses. Officers responded to the location where Fort Bragg Fire personnel were tending to the driver of the vehicle, Victor Reyna-Viscencio, 27 year old male of Fort Bragg.

Witnesses were transported to the location and positively identified the vehicle as the vehicle that struck the pedestrian. Reyna-Viscencio was transported to Mendocino Cost District Hospital for treatment of his injuries. Due to the extensive injury to his nose, Reyna-Viscencio was transported to Santa Rosa for treatment.

The 67 year old victim was flown to Santa Rosa for treatment. She was in stable condition at the time of the transport, and underwent surgical procedures at Santa Rosa Memorial Hospital.
