EVENT OUTLINE

Trees & Planting Supplies: The City of Fort Bragg will purchase up to \$800 of trees from Devil Mountain Wholesale Nursery and provide the compost and mulch needed. Conservation Works will deliver these trees and provide any others along with necessary soil amendments and installation equipment.

Irrigation and Protective Caging: Water gators, fencing and stakes will be provided by the City of Fort Bragg.

Staff & Volunteer Supplies: Conservation Works will provide all food, water, and consumables. Thanksgiving Coffee will be providing coffee to consume during the event on a donation basis.



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Table Displays: Conservation Works will provide all tables, cloths, and display items.

Garbage & Recycling: CV Starr Community Center will provide access to their large dumpsters, including a compost bin.

Planting Support Services: The City of Fort Bragg will mark the approved planting area devoid of underground utilities.

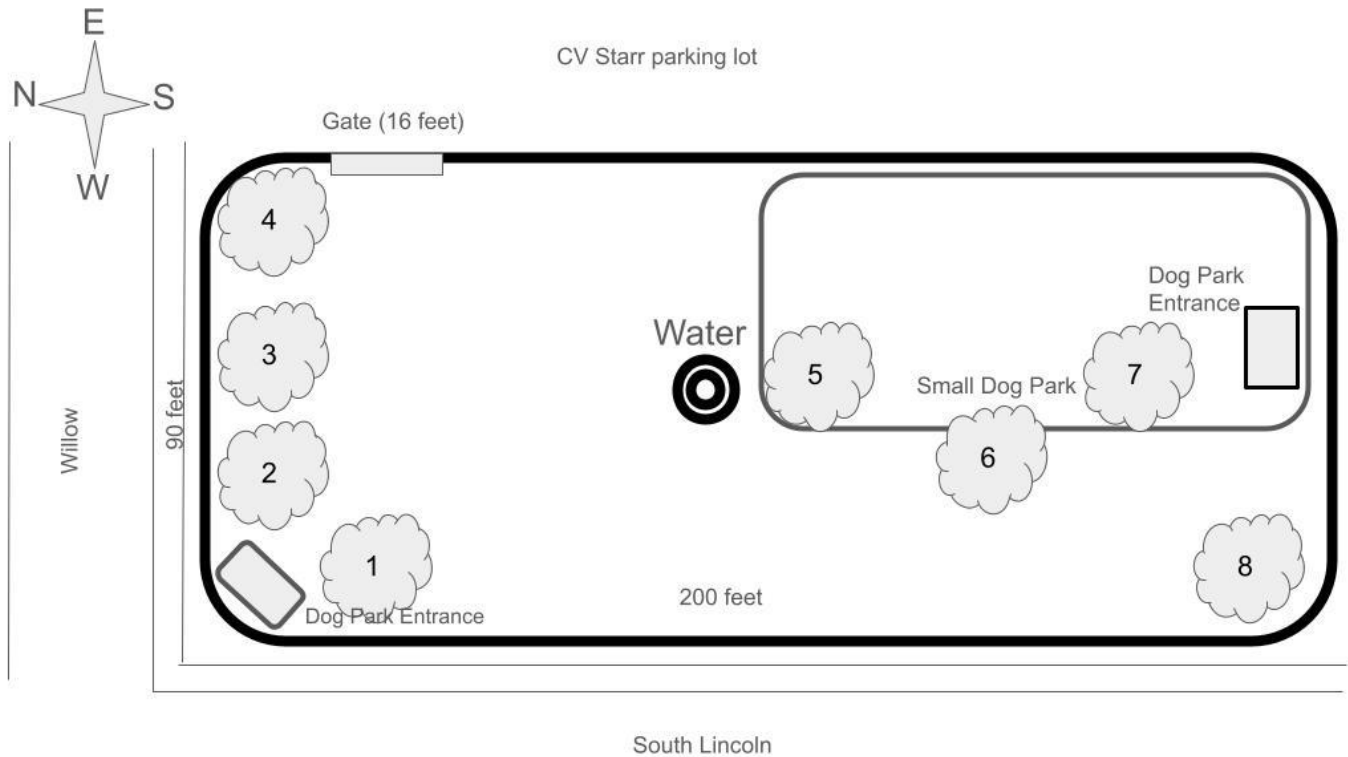
