Ready.gov is a National public service campaign designed to educate and empower the American people to prepare for, respond to and mitigate emergencies, including natural and man-made disasters. MyHazards is a tool from the California Office of Emergency Services for the general public to discover hazards in their area (earthquake, flood, fire and tsunami) and learn steps to reduce personal risk. Using the MyHazards tool, users may enter an address, city, zip code, or may select a location from a map. The tool than presents information on the risks identified within the search radius, and recommended actions to reduce risk.

EMERGENCY ALERT AND WARNING

MendoAlert (the Mendocino County Alert and Warning Notification System) allows you to opt-in to receive notifications via phone calls, text messages, e-mail and more based on locations you care about. You can choose to receive notifications about events that may affect your home, workplace, family's schools and more. This system is opt-in, so residents must register to receive alerts.

This system will be used to notify you about imminent threats to health and safety as well as optional informational notifications that affect your locations or work environments. Administrators will send notifications regarding severe weather, flooding, gas leaks, police activity, and more.

COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM (CERT) TRAINING

The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can better assist themselves and others following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help.
